



APPG for Roadside Rescue and Recovery

To whom it may concern,

Following the formation of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Roadside Rescue and Recovery in November of the 2018, the Group is now calling for evidence for the subject of its first inquiry: safety concerns within the roadside rescue and recovery industry.

The intent of the Group is to collect written submissions followed by one oral session towards the end of April. The deadline for written submissions will be **Friday 1st April 2019**, after which written submissions will be analysed and a selection of respondents whose evidence represents a balanced cross-section of opinion will be asked to attend and give oral evidence before the APPG in Parliament.

In the interests of balance and its ambition to collect evidence from as wide a range of sources as possible, the Group will be calling for evidence from a range of representative bodies from various different parts of the industry, individual company owners and their employees, and government agencies.

I would ask that you please send your responses via email to secretariat of the APPG: contact@csrrr.org. Please be sure to include your name and contact details, as well as a brief description of the organisation you represent and you're role within that organisation. Please do not feel you have to answer every question. Please answer in as much or as little detail as you feel able to.

Reflecting on the views of those you represent:

1. Have casualties, 'near misses' and wider safety concerns affected the businesses and groups you represent? If so, how?
2. What is the scale of safety incidents and near misses within the industry?
3. What safety measures, if any, would you recommend to address safety concerns and why?
4. What effect, if any, has the Government's roll-out of All Lane Running 'Smart' motorways had on the safety on the groups you represent?
5. What measures could be taken to address any safety concerns with All Lane Running motorways?

Once again, I would be extremely grateful if you felt able to provide the APPG with a written submission completed by **Friday April 1st 2019**
